GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS.

The City Letter Carriers deliver four times a day (Saturday excepted), and Suburban Carriers twice daily; the hours of closing and despatch are stated below, viz.:

Post closes at General Post Office.

CITY OF SYDNEY—8.30 and 11.45 a.m., 2 and 4 p.m. (Saturday excepted), 8.30 and 11.45 a.m. on Saturday.
SUBURBS—8.30 a.m., and 1.30 p.m.

Letter Carriers leave General Post Office.

CITY OF SYDNEY—8.45 a.m., 12.15, 2.30, and 4.30 p.m. Saturday, only two deliveries, 8.45 a.m., and 12.15 p.m.
SUBURBS—8.45 a.m., and 2 p.m.

Mails close at General Post Office.

COUNTRY DISTRICTS—Western. Daily, 8.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. as far as Penrith, and 6.30 p.m. for places beyond. Southern. Daily, 8.30 a.m. as far as Goulburn, 4 p.m. to Picton, and 7 p.m. for places beyond. Northern. Daily by Hunter River steamers at 9.30 p.m., and per Grafton steamers at 8 p.m., about twice a week.

LATE LETTERS.

Late Letters for despatch inland, bearing a Late Fee of 2d. in addition to regular postage, will be received at the General Post Office as follows:—

Western District, as far as Penrith, Daily, 4 to 4.15 p.m.
Do beyond Penrith, Daily, 6.30 to 7.15 p.m.

Southern District, as far as Goulburn, Daily, 8.30 to 8.45 a.m.

Southern District, for all places beyond Picton, Daily, 7 to 7.30 p.m.

Northern District, for Grafton steamers, 8 to 8.15 p.m.
Do for Hunter River steamers, 9.30 to 9.45 p.m.

For Coastwise steamers, 15 minutes after the time fixed for closing mail.

A special arrangement permits of the reception of Late Letters for places within the Colony and for Victoria at the letter boxes on the despatching side of the Redfern Railway Station, for places beyond Penrith or Picton, up to 7.55 and 8.50 p.m. respectively, and also for the "Limited Express" train, for Melbourne only, up to 4.50 p.m. In the Mail Van letter boxes correspondence will further be received up to 8 p.m. for the Western District, and 9 p.m. for the Southern, beyond Penrith and Picton. Letters posted in all Mail Van Receivers must bear the late fee of 2d. in addition to the ordinary postage, otherwise they will not be forwarded until next post.

At Country Post Offices, Late Letters can be posted to within a quarter-of-an-hour of the time of despatch of the Mails, on payment of a Late Fee of 2d. In certain cases letters can also be forwarded, if posted (with a Late Fee of 2d.), between the hours of 9.30 and 9.45 p.m. All Late Fees must be paid by stamps.

Late Letters, intended for despatch by the Intercolonial Mails, will be received for a quarter-of-an-hour after the time fixed for the closing of the Mails; but such letters must each bear an extra two-penny stamp as a Late Fee, or they will not be forwarded.

Letters placed on board steamers or sailing vessels for any of the Australasian Colonies after the Mails have closed at the General Post Office, should bear the ordinary

postage rate, with a Late Fee of 2d., and if not fully prepaid, the deficiency will be charged on delivery.

LETTERS CONTAINING GOLD TRANSMITTED WITHIN THE COLONY.

Not exceeding 1 oz. (avoirdupois weight) 4d.
And so on, increasing 4d. for every additional oz. or fraction of an oz.

BOOK PACKETS.

Book Packets and samples intended for despatch to the Country Districts must be posted as follows, viz. :—
Western Districts—8 a.m. as far as Penrith; 4 p.m. as far as Penrith; and places beyond, 6.30 p.m.
Southern Districts—8.30 a.m. as far as Goulburn; 4 p.m. to Picton; and 6.30 p.m. for places beyond.
Northern Districts—7 p.m.
Newspapers for the West must be posted by 7.30 a.m. and 3 p.m.; South, 7.30 a.m. and 3 p.m.; and for the North by 6 p.m.

Mails for despatch by steamers are closed an hour previous to the advertised time of the vessel's departure.

Mails are made up for despatch by sailing vessels twice a day, viz. :—At noon and 6 p.m.

The Letter Delivery Office is open from 8.45 a.m. to 9 p.m. The Dead Letter Office is open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., Saturdays excepted, when it closes at 1 p.m. The Inquiry Office and Postage Stamps Sale Office are open from 8.15 a.m. to 9 p.m. The Registered Letter Office is open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Letters for registration intended to be forwarded by Mails to be despatched between the hours mentioned (except the English Mails, vide page 3, and other mails sent south by overland line beyond Picton, closing at 6 p.m.) must be posted half-an-hour before the time appointed for the closing of such Mails. The Newspaper Delivery Office is open from 8.45 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The following arrangement will be observed on all public holidays, viz. :—

The General Post Office will be open from 8.45 a.m. to 10 a.m.

The first morning delivery only will be effected by Letter Carriers.

The Country mails usually despatched in the afternoon and evening, also the Coastwise, Intercolonial, and Foreign mails, will close at 9 a.m. unless otherwise specially intimated.

The Iron Pillar Receivers and Recievers at Suburban Post Offices will only be cleared at the first usual hour on such day.

All letters received in this Colony from any part beyond the seas (except the Australasian Colonies and South Sea Islands) that have not been regularly posted at the place of despatch, will be charged with the Colonial ship rates of postage, 6d. per ½ oz.

No charge whatever is made on letters received in this Colony from places beyond the Colony, except in cases of insufficiently stamped or re-directed letters, provided they have been duly posted, and prepaid at place of despatch.

Should information be at any time required from a Country Postmaster, in writing, the public are recommended to enclose a Stamped Directed Envelope for

reply, as the Country Postmasters cannot forward an answer unless it is prepaid in postage stamps.

The public are requested to note that addresses and changes of addresses will be recorded and attended to in this Office for 12 months only—that period being considered to afford ample time to correspondents to address their letters properly. When sending address persons should carefully state whence they expect letters.

SYDNEY AND ITS SUBURBS.

The Town Rate of Postage, viz., 1d. the ½ ounce, is levied upon all correspondence posted in the City of Sydney for delivery at the Post Offices mentioned below, and also upon correspondence posted in any of such Post Offices for the said City, or for any of such Post Offices.

Not exceeding ½ oz. 2 pence.
Exceeding ½ oz., but not exceeding 1 oz. . . . 4 pence,
and so on, increasing 2 pence for every additional ½ ounce or fraction of ½ an ounce.

NOTE.—The Town Rate of Postage, viz., 1d. the ½ ounce, is, however, levied upon all correspondence posted within a 10-mile radius of Newcastle, for delivery anywhere within that radius. The penny postage rate also exists between West Maitland, East Maitland, and Morpeth; between Bathurst and Esrom, and between Bathurst and Kelsa.

Letters and packets may be re-directed to the United Kingdom, New Zealand, Victoria, South Australia, Tasmania, Western Australia, Queensland, Fiji Islands, United States, Honolulu, Hong Kong, and China, without prepayment of additional postage, which will, however, except in the cases of South Australia and Tasmania, be charged on delivery.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Any person can have a letter registered by affixing on it, by means of the proper stamps, the amount of the registration fee, in addition to the proper postage, and presenting it at a Post Office during office hours, when a receipt for the same will be given, and every precaution will be adopted to insure its safe delivery by entering it on the Letter Bills, and obtaining a receipt for the same on delivery. As the Post Office, however, is not responsible for the loss of any letter, whether registered or otherwise, parties sending Bank notes or drafts are advised to take the numbers and particulars, and to cut such notes or drafts in halves, and to send them by different posts.

TOWN AND COUNTRY BOOK PACKETS.

Not exceeding 4 ozs., 1 penny.

And for every additional 4 ozs., or portion of 4 ozs., 1 penny.

TOWN AND COUNTRY SAMPLES AND PATTERNS OF MERCHANDISE.

Not exceeding 2 ozs., 1 penny.

And 1d. extra for every additional 2 ozs. or fraction of 2 ozs.

BOOK PACKET REGULATIONS.

1. A book packet may contain any number of separate books or other publications (including printed or lithographed letters, bank pass-books, returns, deeds, affidavits, policies of assurance, depositions, recognizances, powers of attorney), photographs (when not on glass or in cases containing glass or any like substance), drawings, prints, or maps, and any quantity of paper, or any other substance in ordinary use for writing or printing upon; and the books or other publications, prints, maps, &c., may be either printed, written, engraved, lithographed, or plain, or any mixture of these. Further, all legitimate binding, mounting, or covering of a book, &c., or of a portion thereof, is allowed, whether such binding, &c., be loose or attached; as also rollers in the case of prints or maps, markers (whether of paper or otherwise) in the case of books, pens or pencils in the case of pocket books, &c., and, in short, whatever is necessary for the safe transmission of such articles, or usually appertains thereto; but the binding, rollers, &c., must not be sent as a separate packet. Provided that no packet containing valuable money enclosures (such as cheques, drafts, bank notes, &c.) can be transmitted at book packet rates of postage, but must be paid for as a letter.

Circulars.—Letters which are intended for transmission in identical terms to several persons, and the whole or the greater part of which is printed, engraved, or lithographed, may also be sent by book post.

2. A book packet may not contain any letter, or communication of the nature of a letter (whether separate or otherwise), unless it be a circular-letter or be wholly printed; nor any enclosure sealed or closed against inspection. If this rule be infringed, the entire package is charged as a letter.

3. A book packet may be posted either without a cover (in which case it must not be fastened, whether by means of gum, wafer, sealing wax, postage stamp, or otherwise), or in a cover sufficiently open at both ends to admit of the contents being easily withdrawn for examination; otherwise it is treated as a letter. For the greater security of the contents, however, it may be tied at the ends with string, Postmasters being authorized to cut the string in such cases, although if they do so they must again tie up the packet. *The foregoing will not apply to*

official returns forwarded from one Government officer to another, which may be transmitted in closed covers, provided the covering envelope bears an endorsement signed by the sender, that the packet contains "Official Returns only."

4. No book packet may be above sixteen ounces in weight, nor above two feet in length, one foot in width, or one foot in depth, unless it be sent to or from one of the Government Offices. The limit of weight is not the same to all countries.

5. When, owing to a great and unusual influx of letters, books, &c., the transmission or delivery of the letters would be delayed if the whole mail were dealt with without distinction, book packets may be kept back till the next despatch or delivery.

6. Any packet posted in fraud or violation of the Post Office Statute or Regulations, or of any Act of the Customs, or containing any letter or epistolary communication, or having less than one rate prepaid as a packet not exceeding two ounces in weight, or which shall have no postage, or less than one rate of postage, in accordance with the rate chargeable thereon, or shall contain or have on the outside thereof, any profane, obscene, or libellous address, signature, picture, or thing, must be sent to the Dead Letter Office forthwith.

7. Packets containing returns of births, baptisms, marriages, and deaths, may be transmitted unstamped, the postage being paid upon delivery, if marked as containing such returns only, and signed by the Clergyman or the District Registrar transmitting them.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST REGULATIONS.

1. The Pattern and Sample Post is restricted to *bond fide trade patterns or samples of merchandise*. Goods sent for sale, or in execution of an order (however small the quantity may be), or any articles sent by one private individual to another which are not actually patterns or samples, are not admissible.

2. Patterns or samples, when practicable, must be sent in covers open at the ends and in such a manner as to be easy of examination. But samples of seeds, drugs, and such like articles, which cannot be sent in covers of this kind (but such articles only), may be posted enclosed in boxes, or in bags of linen or other material fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; or in the case of samples of seeds, &c., in bags entirely closed, provided such closed bags are transparent, so as to enable the Officers of the Post Office readily to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

3. There must be no writing or printing upon or in any packet except the address of the person for whom it is intended, the address of the sender, a trademark or number, and the price of the articles.

4. Packets containing samples of trade patterns above sixteen ozs. in weight, or exceeding two feet in length, one foot in width, or one foot in depth (unless it be sent to or from one of the Government Offices), or reasonably suspected to contain articles likely to injure the other portions of the mail, or the person or officer or servant of the Post Office, may be refused. The limit of weight is not the same to all countries.

5. Packets containing seeds, not sent as samples, may be forwarded as inland packets only; such packets, must not, however, exceed eight ounces in weight.

6. Any packet posted in fraud or violation of the Post Office Statute or Regulations, or of any Act of the Customs, or containing any letter or epistolary communication, or having less than one rate prepaid as a packet not exceeding two ounces in weight, or which shall have no postage, or less than one rate of postage, in accordance with the rate chargeable thereon, or shall contain or have on the outside thereof, any profane, obscene or libellous address, signature, picture or thing, must be sent to the Dead Letter Office, forthwith.

POSTAGE STAMPS AND STAMPED ENVELOPES.

Postage stamps at present in use—1d., 2d., 3d., 4d., 5d., 6d., 8d., 9d., 10d., 1s., 6s.

One-penny stamped envelopes, 25 in a packet, in size 4½ in. x 2½ in.—2s. 3d. per packet.

Two-penny stamped envelopes, 25 in a packet, in size 4½ in. x 2½ in.—4s. 6d. per packet.

Newspaper wrappers, 25 in a packet, for 2s. 2d.

One-penny and two-penny stamps will be impressed on envelopes supplied by the public for the purpose under the following regulations:—

1st. Not fewer than 500 envelopes of any one size can be received at any time.

2nd. No envelopes can be received for stamping which are too thin to bear the impression of the die.

3rd. Envelopes provided by the Post Office Department, with the proper stamp thereon, will be substituted for any which may be spoiled in the operation of stamping.

4th. No fee is charged for stamping.

5th. No commission is allowed on envelopes stamped for licensed vendors.

6th. Payment for impressing envelopes to be made in advance.

Envelopes for registration purposes, with embossed registration stamp, 4 in. x 2½ in. and 6 in. x 3 in.—4d. each.

Arrangements have been made by which firms, &c., may print their names on the back of postage stamps, or perforate their initials in each stamp by means of any machines submitted to and approved of by the Postmaster General. Postage stamps so marked must not be purchased by any postmaster or other persons, as the object of placing a private mark thereon is to prevent stamps being stolen and sold.

Stamps with the letters "O.S." marked thereon in black are issued for the use of Government officials under the following regulations:—

1. Postage stamps having the letters "O.S." printed thereon are only available for official letters, the envelopes of which must bear the endorsement "O.H.M.S.," with the name of the Department (or Branch thereof) from which they are sent, in the corner; or, in the case of letters addressed to a Department, the name of the sender written in a corner; and, in default of this being done, letters stamped with "O.S." stamps will be opened, under the provisions of the Postage Act, and returned to the senders.

2. Under no pretext whatever will these stamps be supplied to Postmasters or be sold by Postmasters, or be purchased or exchanged for other stamps at any Post Office.

3. Public officers in the country will not be able to procure "O.S." stamps from the country Postmasters, but can obtain them from the Head of their Department in Sydney, to whom they will be supplied on requisition in the usual manner.

PURCHASE OF POSTAGE STAMPS AND STAMPED ENVELOPES FROM THE PUBLIC.

New South Wales Postage Stamps, not soiled, damaged, marked on the back with the name of a firm, &c., in print, or with perforated initials, will be purchased by the Cashier of the General Post Office, in lots of not less value than £1, and all Postmasters in the Colony will be permitted to afford the public a similar convenience. The charge for this accommodation is 5 per cent.

Spoiled but unused stamped envelopes will be purchased by the Cashier of the General Post Office, in lots bearing stamps to the value of not less than £1. A discount of 10 per centum will be charged for the accommodation.

LICENSES TO SELL POSTAGE STAMPS.

Any respectable person, not in the service of the Post Office or Telegraph Department, wishing for a license to sell postage stamps for the convenience of the public should make written application to that effect to the Secretary of the General Post Office.

Licenses are revocable at pleasure, and only authorize the sale of stamps at the house or shop mentioned in the license.

Letters from licensed vendors of postage stamps containing remittances for stamps should be addressed to the "Cashier, General Post Office," and marked, "From (name), Licensed Stamp Vendor (address)." Such letters must, however, be prepaid as ordinary letters, but Postmasters will register them free of charge.

INLAND CARD POST.

Post Cards, whether Official or Private, being each impressed with a penny stamp, may be transmitted between places in the colony of New South Wales, under the following conditions and regulations:—

1. The front or stamped side of the card to be for the address only, in addition to the words "Post Card." There must be nothing else written, printed, or otherwise impressed on the front side of the card, nor must there be any writing or printing across the stamp. On the reverse side any communication, whether of the nature of a letter or otherwise, may be written or printed. Nothing whatever may be attached; nor may the card be folded, cut, or in any other respect altered. If any of these conditions be infringed, the card will be charged 2d. on delivery.

2. No card other than those issued by the Government, or a private card impressed with a penny stamp, under the special authority of the Postmaster General, will pass under a penny stamp, if it bear on it a written communication of the nature of a letter.

3. Should a Post Card be observed to bear upon it anything of an obscene, libellous, or otherwise obviously objectionable nature, it will not be delivered.

4. When owing to a great and unusual influx of letters, books, &c., the transmission or delivery of the letters would be delayed if the whole mail were dealt with without distinction, Post Cards may be kept back until the next despatch or delivery.

Official Cards will be sold at the rate of one penny each. The impressed stamp of a postal card cannot be used as a postage stamp.

For information as to the conditions under which printed cards may be impressed, application can be made to the Secretary to the Post Office.

Reply Post Cards, that is, double cards, each half of which has a penny stamp impressed thereon, one-half being intended for use by the sender, and the other by the addressee in transmitting a reply, may be purchased for 2d. each, and are available for transmission between all places in the Colony of New South Wales.

Postmasters must keep a stock of cards for sale. Post Cards posted for places beyond the Colony will be treated as letters when bearing additional postage necessary, in adhesive stamps, to the 1d. impressed stamp.

NEWSPAPERS.

1. Newspapers printed and posted within the Colony are transmitted free of charge, excepting Newspapers posted at any Post Office or Receiver in Sydney, for delivery within the boundaries of the City, and newspapers posted after seven days from the date of publication, which are subject to a charge of one penny each.

2. Newspapers received from beyond the Colony, *attached in monthly parts*, are, when re-posted, subjected to the charge of one penny for every number contained therein.

3. Newspapers for the United Kingdom are chargeable with one penny each, if intended for transmission by Mail Packet via San Francisco, Brindisi, and Marseilles, or per direct ships. By Torres Straits 2d. each.

4. Newspapers for British Colonies and Foreign Coun-

tries, sent through the United Kingdom, &c., are subject to the rates of postage shown in Table A.

5. Newspapers for the neighbouring Colonies, and for all places which are not liable to postage under Table A, are transmitted free of charge (provided they are papers published in New South Wales, and not over 7 days old), and all newspapers from such places received in the Colony are delivered without charge.

6. Bulk parcels containing newspapers over seven days old, or printed out of the Colony and posted by registered newspaper publishers or by newsvendors for transmission within the Colony, or for other Australian Colonies, New Zealand, and Fiji, are charged one penny per pound or fraction thereof.

7. The postage chargeable on newspapers must be paid by affixing stamps of sufficient value, and no newspaper will be forwarded unless it bears the full amount of postage.

8. Newspapers, on being re-directed by Postmasters, are not liable to additional postage.

9. Newspapers may be posted at the General Post Office for the West and South to 7.30 a.m. and 3 p.m.; and for the North by 6 p.m.

For despatch by Intercolonial Mails, per steamers, one hour previous to the time fixed for posting letters.

RULINGS OF THE POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT.

The Pattern and Sample Post within the Colony of New South Wales, and between it and the neighbouring Colonies, is restricted to *bona fide* patterns or samples of merchandise, which must not exceed 10 ozs. in weight, and packets of seeds must not exceed 8 ozs.

Tradesmen's bills or accounts cannot be sent at packet rates, but must be prepaid in postage stamps at letter rates.

Duty stamps cannot be used as postage stamps.

Trade reports of the Trade Protection Institute are not allowed to pass through the post free of charge. Packet rate must be paid thereon.

PRIVATE BOXES.

1. Locked Private Letter Boxes are provided at the General Post Office, Sydney, for merchants and others (of three sizes, as required) on payment of one, two, or three guineas per annum *in advance*. Payment to date from 1st January. [NOTE.—To meet the convenience of the public, payment for the use of private letter boxes may date from the 1st April, 1st July, or 1st October of any year; but in this case the fee for the next year, from the 1st January, must be paid in addition to the payment for the broken period of the current year.] In country offices where private boxes are provided, the charge is one guinea per annum *in advance*.

2. A key will be supplied with each box (when let) without extra charge, but 2s 6d will be required for each additional key supplied.

3. When a key is lost, information should at once be given to the Superintendent of the Mail Branch or Postmaster, and a new lock will be fitted in the box, and fresh key supplied, for which a charge of 7s. 6d. will be made.

SHIPPING MAIL NOTICES.

One copy of the Ships' Mail Notice published each day will be supplied to box-holder on payment, in advance of 2s. 6d. per annum, to date from 1st January.

REGULATIONS FOR PRIVATE MAIL BAGS.

PRIVATE BAGS—ANNUAL CHARGE.

Postmasters are permitted to make arrangements with settlers upon Mail routes requiring the accommodation of a Private Bag upon payment (in advance) of a sum not exceeding Two Pounds Two Shillings per annum to the Postmaster who has to make up the bag, subject to the following regulations, viz.:—

LETTER BAG TO BE FURNISHED BY PERSON REQUIRING SAME.

1. The bag must be of leather, and provided at the cost of the person requiring it.

TO BE SEALED BEFORE DISPATCHED.

2. The Postmaster will close and seal or lock the bag securely before dispatching it; and it must be returned in like manner, securely locked or sealed with some seal the impression of which is known by the Postmaster.

OWNERS OF BAGS RESPONSIBLE FOR POSTAGE AND REGISTERED LETTER RECEIPTS.

3. The bag may contain letters for all persons who give *written authorities* to the Postmaster to enclose them; but it must be distinctly understood that the person paying for the private bag is responsible for the postage of all unpaid letters, and for the receipts for all those which may be registered. In case of non-payment of postage, or detention of registered letter receipts, the Postmaster shall decline to forward any more letters of either of these classes.

CONTRACTORS BOUND TO CARRY BAGS ON ROAD, BUT NOT TO BE DELAYED.

A contractor is bound to convey and deliver free of charge, all bags given to him by the Postmasters, or under their instructions; but is not required to deviate in the slightest from the usual mail route, and is on no account to be delayed. Should the return bag not be ready at the appointed time and place, the contractor must not wait for it.

NOTE.—Letters forwarded in private bags for delivery at the township where such private bags are opened, should bear postage at the rate of 2d. per ounce and not 1d. per ounce, as seems to be the impression among some private bag owners. Telegrams forwarded in this way to any Postmaster for transmission to destination should also bear postage.

MONEY ORDERS.

Money Orders may be obtained and made payable at the following Post Offices in New South Wales between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m., and at Chief office, Sydney, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., except Saturday, when the office is closed at 1 p.m.:—

PRESS TELEGRAMS.

His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information that, in future, no person shall be entitled to send, or any proprietor, publisher, or agent of a newspaper to receive, at press rates, a telegraphic message or messages, in one day, containing more than five hundred (500) words in the aggregate. This restriction, however, will not apply to messages transmitted between the hours of 6 p.m. and 9 a.m.

REGULATIONS IN REGARD TO PRESS MESSAGES.

1. That the said notice shall not apply to Intercolonial or Foreign Telegrams.
2. That the hours within the restriction in the said notice contained shall not apply, be from 6 p.m. to 9 a.m.
3. That if, during any other hours, the line on which a Press telegram is desired to be sent is clear and unoccupied, such telegram, whatever length, may be sent at Press rates; provided that if, during the transmission of such telegram, any private or business telegram or telegrams is or are required to be sent on such line, the Press message so being sent shall be, from time to time, stopped to allow of the transmission of such private or

business telegram or telegrams. (This regulation will be strictly carried out.)

4. That no Press message, Intercolonial, Foreign, or otherwise, shall at any time be sent to a greater extent than 500 words, if there be any other Press message or messages required to be sent on the same line; but Press messages shall be sent in rotation as they come in to the extent of 500 words at a time.

DELAYED TELEGRAMS.

Telegrams marked "DELAYED" may be handed in at any local station during business hours, to be sent at half the ordinary rates within the Colony, such Telegrams to be transmitted after the close of the day's business.

TELEGRAMS FORWARDED BY POST.

Telegrams posted at any Post Office (which is not also a Telegraph Station) in the Colony will be forwarded by first mail to the nearest Telegraph Office, and be transmitted thence by wire to destination, provided unobliterated postage stamps are affixed to the form on which the message is written (in the place provided for the purpose) sufficient in value to defray the cost of the message, and that the message be enclosed in an envelope prepaid with the requisite amount of postage, and directed to the Telegraph Station Master at—(give the name of the nearest Telegraph Station, which can be obtained from the Postmaster on enquiry). All Telegrams for Post must be written in a clear and legible manner on the form specially provided, and in accordance with the printed instructions on such form. Telegrams addressed to Post Towns to which there is no telegraphic communication will be transmitted by wire to the nearest Telegraph Station and forwarded thence to destination by first Post without additional charge.

DELIVERY OF TELEGRAMS.

All ordinary telegrams will, as a rule, be delivered, as in England, without receipts, and generally through the Post Office, so far as the City of Sydney is concerned. In connection with this change the following will be the arrangements:—

1. All telegrams marked "Urgent," and all cablegrams will be delivered, as at present, by foot or mounted messengers, and receipts will be taken as usual, with the exception of those arriving overnight, which will be placed in the private boxes for the morning delivery.
2. All other telegrams addressed to persons within the boundaries of the City will, as a rule, be delivered through the post, either by means of the private letter-boxes or the ordinary morning delivery by letter carrier.
3. Notwithstanding the foregoing, it will be understood that the Superintendent Officer will use his discretion in delivering telegrams with every despatch by means of the mounted messengers in all cases where the message appears to be of an important and urgent character, whether so marked or not. Persons wishing, however, to have their ordinary telegrams delivered by messenger, as at present, can have this done by communicating their wishes to that effect to the Superintendent of Telegraphs.

SPECIAL DELIVERY OF TELEGRAMS FOR PLACES TWO MILES OR MORE FROM A TELEGRAPH OFFICE.

Special arrangements will be made for delivery, when practicable, and a special rate will be charged, but the department accept no responsibility for the delay or non-delivery of such messages.

REGULATIONS—NEW SOUTH WALES DEPARTMENT.

- 1.—Messages must be written with ink in a clear and legible manner on the forms provided for that purpose, and must bear a proper date and address; the signature of the sender in each case being required in authentication of the Message, and as subscribing to the conditions imposed. All figures must be written in words.
- 2.—As a general rule all Messages are to be prepaid; but in cases of emergency or distress persons may be

allowed to send Messages to be paid for by the receiver.

3.—Payment of charges in advance will be required, except for replies to Interrogatory Messages on which the sender has written "Reply paid here." No charge will be made for date, address, or signature of the Message.

4.—Messages will be delivered free within one mile of the Office; over that distance portage or cab hire will be charged, and boat hire on messages to be delivered on ship board. Telegrams requiring to be delivered by special messenger will only be accepted subject to the Department being able to procure such messenger; and in all cases telegrams will be forwarded at the sender's risk.

5.—Where an immediate reply to a Message is required, the sender of such Message is requested to append the words "Reply by Telegraph." The Messenger charged with the delivery of the Message will then be directed to wait five minutes for the reply, in order to facilitate its transmission to the sender of the Message.

6.—Messages can be transmitted in cypher at fifty per cent. above the ordinary rate of charges. Cypher words must not consist of more than three syllables.

7.—In order to provide against mistakes in the transmission of messages by the Electric Telegraph, every Message of consequence ought to be REPEATED by being sent back from the Station at which it is to be received to the Station from which it is originally sent. Half the usual price for transmission will be charged for repeating the Message. The Government will not be responsible for mistakes in the transmission of unrepeat Messages, from whatever cause they may arise; nor will the Government be responsible for mistakes in the transmission of a repeated Message, nor for any delay in the transmission or delivery, nor for non-transmission or non-delivery of any Message, whether repeated or unrepeat, to any extent above £5.

8.—Except in cases of emergency, illness, &c., or Messages on the service of the State, Messages will be transmitted in the order in which they are received; and all Messages will be held strictly confidential.

9.—If from any circumstances a Message is not sent within a reasonable time sufficient to destroy the value of the despatch, the Clerk is instructed to give the person sending the Message information of the fact, with the reason of the delay; it will then be optional with the person to withdraw such Message, and receive back the amount paid.

10.—No application for copies of Messages after delivery will be entertained, unless at the request of the sender, or the person to whom the Message is addressed; and in all cases the Superintendent will require satisfactory reasons for the application.

11.—Messages will be kept in the strict charge of the Superintendent for the space of TWO YEARS, after which they will be burned in the presence of the Superintendent.

12.—Offices will be kept open for the transmission of Messages, from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., Sundays excepted.

13.—Inquiries respecting Messages cannot be entertained unless copies are produced.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

The Electric Telegraph Offices throughout the colony on Public Holidays are open from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m., and between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 p.m., except offices marked thus †, which are only open from 9 to 10 a.m.

THE NEW SOUTH WALES TELEPHONE SYSTEM.

REGULATIONS.

1. Applications for connection with the Telephone System, through the Central Exchange or otherwise, should be forwarded to the Superintendent of Electric Telegraphs, General Post Office, Sydney, when estimates of the cost of connection will be duly furnished.
2. The work will be carried out by the Government at the expense of the applicant, who will also have to bear

the cost of the instrument or instruments, which must, in all cases, be of the manufacture recommended by the Department.

3. Each subscriber will be required to pay, in advance, a maintenance fee at the rate of £5 per mile, or fraction thereof, per annum.

4. With a view to facilitate business, and for the better conduct of the System, Telephone Messages containing unbecoming expressions must be refrained from, and language of an obscene nature, or of a character calculated to provoke a breach of the peace, is strictly forbidden. Any violation of this regulation will render the offenders liable to have their telephone instruments disconnected from the Telephone Exchange, and their lines dismantled.

47 Vict., 1884.—**SPIRITS.**—All Spirits in bond at the date of the passing of this Act, or proved to the satisfaction of the Collector of Customs to be in proper condition to be delivered at any port in New South Wales prior to the said date, shall be admitted to duty at the actual strength and quantity ascertained on examination in the prescribed manner. Provided that all such Spirits be removed and cleared for home consumption or exportation before the thirtieth day of June, 1884, after which date no allowance shall be made for under proof of Spirits, except as hereinbefore provided, nor for Spirits in cases containing a less quantity than reputed two, three, or four gallon contents.

From this Table it will be seen that the Reversionary Bonus declared at this investigation varies from 2.2 per cent. per annum on the sum assured for a policy one year in force to 5.0 per cent. per annum for a policy 29 years in force.

The cash value of the single bonus of 1883 is sufficient to pay one annual premium in the case of policies which have been in force for 5 years and is equal to a refund of the entire premiums paid during the Quinquennium in the case of policies in force for 30 years.

It is fair to deduce from this Table that the cash value of the annual bonuses hereafter to be declared will be sufficient in the case of policies under Table A to pay from one fourth to the whole of the annual premiums according to the duration of the policies.
