

PREFACE.

JOHN SANDS has again the pleasure of introducing his SYDNEY AND SUBURBAN DIRECTORY to the general public of Sydney and neighbourhood, and for their guidance would respectfully submit the following key in order to facilitate reference.

The GENERAL INDEX (page v) is an alphabetically arranged list of every item in the book. Immediate reference to this would save much trouble and time.

The CITY STREETS DIRECTORY (pages 1 to 124), arranged in alphabetical order of names of streets, shewing where they commence, the intersecting and terminal streets, together with the numbers of the houses in the main thoroughfares. This will be found very useful in tracing the exact locality of the more obscure and smaller houses.

The SUBURBAN DIRECTORY (pages 125 to 473) is compiled on the lines of the City streets, as far as possible. The respective Municipalities and Suburbs are shewn in alphabetical order with their boundaries, together with the rates, official lists, &c., collated up to date of collection.

The ALPHABETICAL DIRECTORY (pages 474 to 974) contains the institutions, business, professional and private persons resident in Sydney and suburbs arranged in alphabetical order in the following sequence :—Where entries commence with the same surname institutions and public bodies take precedence ; next come the names of public companies, followed by partnership firms, then the names of individual business and professional people, and lastly private persons.

The TRADES AND PROFESSIONAL DIRECTORY (pages 975 to 1156) contains lists of the trading and professional community only. Index of headings will be found at pages xxix to xxxiii. As much difficulty is experienced in gaining full and accurate information for this Section it has been considered expedient to classify them according to the instructions given to the canvassers. A reference to similar trades being placed under each heading.

A list of leading European Manufacturers will be found at pages 1157 to 1159.

The MISCELLANEOUS DIRECTORY (pages 1160 to 1215) includes Governmental and Parliamentary Lists, Civil, Naval, Military, and Ecclesiastical information, kindly revised to the latest dates by Government and other officials, to whom the publisher tenders his best thanks

A list of firms with fixed pay days (at pages 1207 to 1213), and also a list of firms connected with the Telephone Exchange (pages 1191 to 1200), will, no doubt, be found useful in business circles.

With this issue the publisher has the pleasure of presenting beautifully coloured plans of the suburbs of Enfield, Strathfield, Victoria, Hunter's Hill, St. Leonards, and St. Leonards East. These will, no doubt, be fully appreciated.

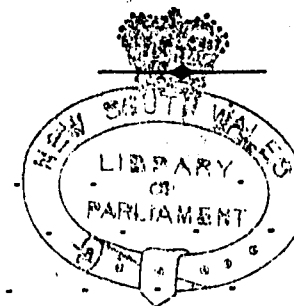

N.S.W. TELEPHONIC SYSTEM.

REGULATIONS

1. Applications for connection with the telephone system through the Central Exchange or otherwise should be forwarded to the Superintendent of Electric Telegraph, General Post Office, Sydney, when estimates of the cost of connection will be duly furnished.

2. The work will be carried out by the Government at the expense of the applicant, who will also have to bear the cost of the instrument or instruments, which must in all cases be of the manufacture recommended by the department.

3. Each subscriber will be required to pay, in advance, a maintenance fee at the rate of £5 per annum for lines not exceeding one mile in length, and for lines over one mile in length, £5 per annum for the first mile, and £2 10s. per annum for each additional mile or fraction thereof.

4. With a view to facilitate business, and for the better conduct of the system, telephone messages containing unbecoming expressions must be refrained from, and language of an obscene nature, or of a character calculated to provoke a breach of the peace, is strictly forbidden. Any violation of this regulation will render the offenders liable to have their telephone instruments disconnected from the Telephone Exchange, and their lines dismantled.
