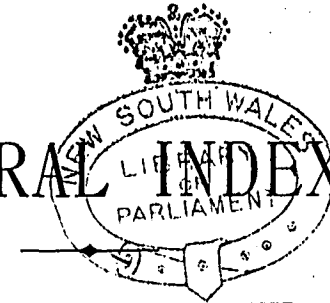

Duties: To hear and determine complaints, references or  
appeals from any person dissatisfied with the conduct,  
proceedings, or decision of any officer empowered to carry  
out the provisions of the Act, the Board having full power  
to adjudicate upon every such question or questions sub-  
mitted for settlement. The Board also has power, upon  
reference from the City Building Surveyor, to inspect and  
order the removal or repair of dangerous and ruinous  
buildings, walls, or other erections, or any awnings, sign-  
boards, or other work not in conformity with the City of  
Sydney Improvement Act

# TELEPHONIC.

## REGULATIONS.

1. Application for connection with the telephone system,  
 through the Central Exchange or otherwise, should be for-  
 warded to the Superintendent of Electric Telegraphs, General  
 Post Office, Sydney, when estimates of the cost of connection  
 will be duly furnished.

2. The work will be carried out by the Government at the  
 expense of the applicant, who will also have to bear the cost of  
 the instrument or instruments, which must in all cases be of  
 the manufacture recommended by the department.

3. Each subscriber will be required to pay, in advance, a  
 maintenance fee at the rate of £. per annum for lines not ex-  
 ceeding one mile in length, and for lines over one mile in length  
 £5 per annum for the first mile, and £2 10s. per annum for each  
 additional mile or fraction thereof.

4. With a view to facilitate business, and for the better con-  
 duct of the system, telephone messages containing unbecom-  
 ing language must be refrained from, and language of an obscene  
 nature, or of a character calculated to provoke a breach of the  
 peace, is strictly forbidden. Any violation of this regulation  
 will render the offenders liable to have their telephone instru-  
 ments disconnected from the Telephone Exchange, and their  
 lines dismantled.
